**B.U.G.** (Bringing Up Grades): For students who bring up their grades.

Cost: \$85



**Terrific Kids:** Acronym for Thoughtful, Enthusiastic, Respectful, Responsible, Inclusive, Friendly, Inquisitive, Capable. Focus is on character development, self-esteem, and perseverance.

Cost: \$85



**K-Kids:** Student-led community service club for ages 6-12. Focus is on service and a lifetime of caring.

Cost: \$150

**Builders Club:** For middle school/junior high students. Focus is on service, character, and leadership.

Cost: \$460



**Key Club:** For high school students. Focus is on service and leadership in the community and the world.

## 2010-2015 Worldwide Service Project

With the formal announcement of our next Worldwide Service Project, Kiwanis joins again with UNICEF to attack a preventable killer of infants and often their mothers—Maternal/neonatal tetanus (MNT). In 40 countries of the world, tetanus spores, found in soil everywhere, come into contact with open cuts during childbirth. Tiny newborns suffer repeated, painful convulsions and extreme sensitivity to light and touch. There is little hope for survival.



MNT can be prevented with just three doses of a 60-cent immunization, which protects mothers, who then pass on the immunity to their future babies. Eliminating MNT requires vaccines, syringes, safe storage, transportation, and thousands of skilled staff. Our help is needed. The cost is estimated to be \$110 million.

The project's official kickoff will be at the International Convention in Geneva, Switzerland, July 7-10, 2011.
